ACTIVE	Physicians elected to Active membership after Dec. 31, 1988 must: (1) be three-year, ACGME FM residency trained; or (2) have completed either an AOA-approved one-year rotating general or FM internship plus two years of an AOA-approved general or FM residency, or an AOA-approved three-year general or FM residency; or (3) have completed a FM residency program approved by the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) and who were subsequently Board certified by the CFPC and practice exclusively within the United States; or (4) be Board certified by the American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) through reciprocity agreements between the ABFM and foreign colleges of family medicine or general practice; or (5) have held Active membership prior to or as of Dec. 31, 1988. ELIGIBILITY FOR ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

If applicant has never been an Active member, or has not held Active membership within the last two years, CME credits are not required. If the applicant has held Active membership within the last two years, the applicant must provide evidence of 100 CME credits completed during the two years immediately preceding application.

Members who are automatically upgraded to Active membership from Resident membership after completing their family medicine residency training, but who never pay Active dues, are exempt from this CME requirement.

ELIGIBILITY FOR INACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

- ✓ Justification for extenuating circumstances are subject to interpretation and approval by AAFP Board of Directors.
- ✓ No member shall be considered for Inactive membership unless he or she has first been placed in this status by his or her respective constituent chapter.
- ✓ No person may hold Inactive membership who does not hold a current medical license because such license has been revoked as a result of a disciplinary action.
- ✓ Election to Inactive membership shall be for a maximum of one year, unless the member is totally retired, provided, however, that an Inactive member may be re-elected to this classification annually by the Board of Directors.

CONTINUING STUDY REQUIREMENTS

Active members must accrue and report, within each three year re-election term, a minimum of 150 credits of approved CME of which at least 75 must be AAFP Prescribed credit.

DEFINITION OF “APPROVED CME”

In interpreting the “postgraduate study of a nature acceptable to the AAFP Board of Directors,” the general rule is that all AAFP-approved activities are acceptable. Contact with the individual’s constituent (state) chapter is recommended to determine whether an applicant’s credits are acceptable for membership or transfer to another membership classification.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

- ✓ Applications are approved at the national level, subject to AAFP Bylaws.
- ✓ National headquarters completes enrollment. Transfers from one classification to another must generally be approved by the constituent chapter.
- ✓ If all membership requirements are met, membership is continued on an annual basis, unless notification is received from the member.
